What to do with the left-over turkey? If you are lucky enough to have slices of turkey, use about half white and half dark meat for these familiar dishes.

HOT BROWN
In individual casseroles or in a large one, make a layer of buttered toast, turkey and crisp cooked bacon. Cover with a rich cheese sauce. Bake cream sauce and simply add cheddar cheese and season to taste. Top with sliced tomato, more cheese and sliced mushrooms. Heat in hot oven until brown.

TURKEY-BROCCOLI CASSEOLE
This is just as good with chicken. Cook one 10 ounce box of broccoli until just tender. In a buttered casserole add a layer of broccoli, then turkey. Cover with seasoned cheese sauce and top with crushed bits of cracker. Pour about 2 table- spoons of butter over all, bake at 350 degrees until hot.

CHICKEN OR TURKEY WITH SPAGHETTI
Make a light cream sauce, about 1 cup and add 1/2 cup diced turkey, 1/2 cup canned mushrooms, 1/2 cup chopped green pepper, 2 cups cooked spaghetti. Add about 1/2

cup chopped pecans or almonds, and all ingredients together and put in greased baking dish. Top with buttered bread crumbs (or crackers), and grated Parmesan cheese. Bake in 375 degree oven until hot and brown.

CREAM SAUCE
Since the above recipe all call for cream sauce, here is a recipe, perhaps I had better give you a basic recipe for cream sauce. Most cookbooks tell you to use a double boiler. However since I'm not very good at standing in one spot for 15 or 20 minutes stirring and cooking, I use a short cut. Use a heavy sauce pan over low heat and melt 2 tablespoons of butter, as it melts add 1 1/2 to 2 table- spoons of flour. Very carefully and slowly add 1 cup of milk, stirring constantly to keep the sauce smooth. Add salt and pepper to taste. 1 teaspoon or more Worcester'shire sauce. If I am using the sauce for beef or pork dishes, I usually add a bouillon cube or chicken bouillon for flavor. Some- times if the sauce is a bit thick I use the liquid from the canned mushrooms to thin to proper consistency. For cheese sauce just add grated cheddar or a glass of Old English cheddar. Do not try to experiment with sauces. They are made to be used. I usually creamed cheese. Pour about 2 table- spoons of butter over all, bake at 350 degrees until hot.

It is not too early to start some of your Christmas baking, and I think of something better to start with than Kentucky Pecan Pie.

This recipe makes a large cake - enough for three loaves 5 1/2 inches by 9 inches deep and 9 1/2 inches wide at the base and 11 1/2 inches at top. Line pan with buttered paper (butter both sides of paper), including tub, sides and bottom.

PECAN CAKE
1 cup brown sugar
2 1/4 cups white sugar
3/4 pound butter
6 white eggs
4 cups flour, sifted
1 1/2 cups broken pecans (floured)
1 cup whiskey
1 1/2 nutmegs grated (4 teaspoons)
1 1/2 cups raisins (the seeded sticky kind) (floured)
1 cup whiskey

and the lower edge of the emblem should be mounted at least three feet or more above the road surface, and should be maintained in a clean, reflective condition. Any person found violating any provision of this portion of the Kentucky Revised Statutes is guilty of a misdemeanor, and a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$25 will be imposed.

"Slow-moving vehicle emblem" consists of a fluorescent yellow-orange triangle with a dark red reflective border as specified in American Society of Agricultural Engineers R.76 or Society of Automotive Engineers J943 standards. All slow-moving vehicles sold, leased, or rented in, or for use within the Commonwealth of Kentucky after Jan. 1, 1971, shall have affixed to them a standard equipment a slow moving vehicle emblem.

The slow-moving vehicle emblem should be displayed on all slow-moving vehicles operated day or night upon the public roads within the Commonwealth of Kentucky no later than Jan. 1, 1971.

TO TACKLE WASTE DISPOSAL

Gov. Louie B. Nunn announced a five-year program in which 15 Area Development Districts in Kentucky will lead the way in efficient solid-waste disposal. The governor disclosed that Kentucky is the first state in the Southeast and the third state in the nation to gain federal approval of a solid-waste management plan. Grants of U.S. funds are expected in carrying out the program.
