The Moorefield P.T.A. will meet at 2 p.m., Friday, Oct. 9. This is Membership month and the P.T.A. will hold an open house.

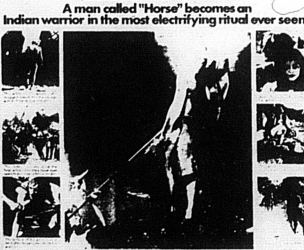

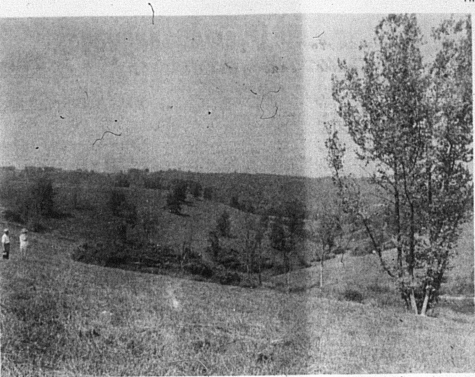

What Is A Field Trial?

There has been considerable publicity given to the coming Fox-hunt and enthusiasm is growing. Some have asked, "What is a Field Trial?" A Field Trial, as the name implies, is testing the hunting dog in the field to determine how he performs in competition, the standard requirements of hunting dogs as established by the National Committee, for a particular breed. Fox Hounds are judged in four classes, namely: Hunting, Trailing, Speed and Drive and Endurance. Trophies are given to the winners in each class. The Championship is determined by the highest general average of all the classes, which usually means just adding the combined score.
