**Transy Given 139 Acres**

Transylvania University has been given 139 acres of farm land in Fleming County by Dr. Rigdon Ratliff, a 1924 alumnae, for use as a biological research and undergraduate teaching facility.

"Transylvania president Irvin E. Lunger, in announcing the gift of the land by Dr. Ratliff, who is formerly of Orange City, Ky., and now a resident of Ann Arbor, Mich., said the land is ideal for use by Transylvania scientists for ecological and natural history studies.

"Our biologists have, for many years, wanted land. In the wild, that could be used for ecological studies by students, faculty and for individual research projects." Dr. Lunger said. "Dr. Ratliff's farm is unusually attractive because the entire western half, approximately 40-50 acres, is heavily wooded in second-growth forest. "The farm will be a valuable asset for use as a convenient area for field trips in connection with such courses as botany and field zoology, and it will also permit us to conduct more ecologically-oriented biological science courses in the future. We are deeply indebted to Dr. Ratliff for his most generous and much needed gift," Dr. Lunger said.

**Learning To Make Bread**

Nicholas County Homemakers are learning how to make salt rising and yeast breads at their April meetings. Bread is the staff of life, and we need four servings per day, says Mrs. Wanda Amos, area food agent, breadmaking dates back to 10,000 years B.C. Ancient Egyptians were the first to make white leavened bread. The three methods of breadmaking were discussed with Mrs. Amos demonstrating the stiff dough method in making yeast rolls, loaf bread and a lattice coffee cake. Bread gives us carbohydrates, which is the cheapest source of energy foods. It is a good source of the B complex vitamins, thiamine, riboflavin and Niacin that are essential for good health and our "well-being."
