### Local Man Hurt In Accident

Deputy Sheriff Larry Harney of Bourbon County reported an accident at 12:20 a.m. on the Millersburg Road about three miles from Paris. The north bound car owned by Harold J. Jones, 109 High Street, Carlisle, left the highway on the right side, traveled 139 feet in a ditch at the side of the road, came back up on the highway, crossed the thoroughfare and ran off the road on the left side, crashing through a fence on the Amos Turvey farm and then traveling another 120 feet before it struck a tree, Deputy Harney said. Jones, who is in the U.S. Army, and is stationed at Fort Knox, told Deputy Harney he had picked up a hitchhiker while traveling toward Paris and had stopped in Paris to drink a beer. The deputy quoted Jones as saying that as they drove out of Paris he had seen the car was wrecked. Deputy Harney stated Jones told him the hitchhiker, who was unidentified, fled the scene after the accident. Jones was admitted to the Bourbon County Hospital.
