My Trip To The Greenhouse

As we were studying plant growth in science we decided to go to Small's Greenhouse. We needed to learn about watering, sunlight, and temperatures for plants.

Mr. Small told us some very interesting facts about plants. Petunias are related to tobacco plants. They are grown from seeds and bloom into lovely flowers in assorted colors.

We went through four greenhouses filled with plants such as tomatoes and cabbage, and flowers such as petunias, geraniums, and mums.

Mr. Small talked about pine trees. He said it takes 20 years for the pines to produce cones. We asked Mr. Small about cooling systems. He cools his greenhouses by large fans. Pipes carry the cool air into the greenhouses.

The cool air comes out holes in the pipes and blows the hot air out the greenhouses.

Some plants can grow on top of them to start or stop their growth according to the need of time for arrangements.
