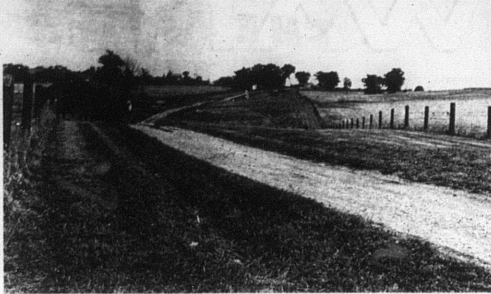

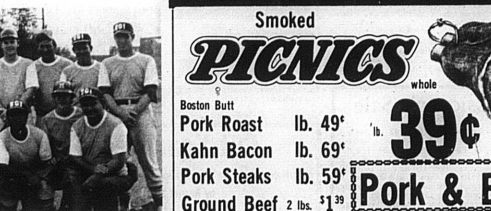
**Interested?**
