LIME PICKLES

7 lbs. cucumbers after peeling and slicing lengthwise in about quarters or less. Cover with 2 cups lime and 2 gal. water. Let stand 24 hours.

Rinse several times with clean water. Cover with cold water, let stand 3 hours. Drain and cover with 2 cups vinegar, 9 cups sugar, 1 Tablespoon salt, 1 Tablespoon pickling spice, 1 Tablespoon whole cloves, 1 Tablespoon celery seed. Leave overnight.

Use 2 cups whole small cucumbers, 2 cups sliced cucumbers, 2 cups string beans, broken and string, 1 1/2 inch pieces, 3 green peppers, chopped, 3 red peppers, chopped, 2 cups quartered small green tomatoes, and 2 cups cauliflower florets. Cover with brine (1/2 cup salt to 1 qt. water) and let stand overnight. Drain, rinse in fresh water, drain again one hour, begin to boiling, drain, add mustard dressing and simmer 5 minutes. Pack into clean hot jars and seal. For the MUSTARD DRESSING:

FRANKFORT - The proposal to remove the live animal products from prescription drugs and health care products during the 1970 session of the Legislature, the estimated loss here in revenue was only \$8.5 million.

Generally speaking, raw materials going into manufactured products are not taxed, and several other items are tax free - such as production on machinery and equipment. Items that are taxed on the sale of the product, such as farm machinery, in 1968. Reports from across the state indicate that the tax elimination is catching with voters in many places.

The Farm Bureau takes sides on many legislative matters that do not directly affect the farmers, but it is a little hard to fathom how they would oppose elimination of the sales tax from "take home" goods since today's farmers buy a lot of items in food stores.
