



Lapnick: A Job Hazard
Near the end of her lunch hour, a stenographer sat down in the company lounge to put on her slippers. But the boss had balance scales left, suffering a back injury. Could she collect workers' compensation?



The company insisted that the stenographer was not on the job when she was not 'on the job' when hurt. Nevertheless, a court upheld her claim.

'Applying cosmetics was not an incident of her employment,' said the judge. 'It added no comfort and self-esteem and thereby permitted her to work more efficiently.'

Generally speaking, workers' compensation covers injuries that occur only while doing the work. But when doing other work closely related to the job...

For example, it applies when an employer is getting a drink of coffee or going to the lavatory.

In fact, workers' compensation may apply even before the work has begun. Take the case of a hotel waitress...

A hotel waitress, arriving early, headed first to the powder room to change into working slippers. On the way, she slipped and broke her right ankle.

However, the law usually will not approve a compensation claim if the victim's activity was a violation of company rules and regulations.

In another case, a bakery worker was injured while trying to force a stuck right window.
