

# Kay's Kitchen

Christmas is sneaking up on us and with so many things to do you may want to start making plans for some menus for different occasions. Here are some pie recipes that are easy to make and delicious.

The first one comes from my sister, Margaret Callaway in Richmond, Va., and recommends it highly.

### CHOCOLATE ALMOND PIE

Dissolve 1 teaspoon instant coffee in 2 tablespoons water. Add broken 7 1/2 ounce chocolate almond candy bar, stirring over low heat until melted. Cool thoroughly. Mix about 1 1/2 cups grated coconut with 2 tablespoons melted butter. Shape into pie plate and

bake at 325 degrees until golden brown (10 minutes). Cool thoroughly. To chocolate mixture, add 4 cups of whipped cream, folding in. Heap into crust and freeze for several hours or overnight. (It won't freeze solid.) Top with more whipped cream and toasted almond flaked almonds before serving. Remove pie from freezer before using and cut it in refrigerator. It is delicious with commercial whipped topping, also rich.

### BOURBON PIE

1 cup sugar  
1 tablespoon flour  
3 egg yolks, beaten

### JAM CAKE

1 cup white sugar  
3/4 cup shortening  
2 cups flour  
1 heaping teaspoon soda  
2 cups flour  
2 teaspoons clove  
2 teaspoons allspice  
1 cup blackberry jam  
cup cold strong black coffee  
egg until fluffy. Add eggs which have been slightly beaten with a fork. Stir together the flour, soda and spices; add flour mixture, a little at a time, alternating with coffee. Mix well, then add blackberry jam, mix well.

### CHOCOLATE MINTS

Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) for about 1 hour or until cake taster comes out clean. I bake this in a tube pan. It would take 30 to 35 minutes if baked in layers. Mrs. Paul Stone  
Use with your favorite caramel icing, in case you need a good recipe to try this one.

### CARAMEL FUDGE FROSTING

1 1/2 cups firmly packed brown sugar  
1 cup rich milk  
1/2 cup cocoa powder  
Dash of salt  
2 teaspoons vanilla  
Bring sugar and milk to a boil, stirring constantly; boil, covered until small amount forms a soft ball when dropped into cold water; stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and add butter, salt and vanilla. When lukewarm, beat until mixture is thick enough to spread. If frosting stiffens while spreading, place over hot water to keep
