## Bluejackets defeat Bourbon County and M. M. I. last week

The Nicholas County Bluejackets had one heck of a big week in basketball action. A big surprise was their slim 44-43 victory over Bourbon County last Tuesday night and their more expected runaway victory of 50-25 over Millersburg Military Institute Friday.

The Jackets improved a good deal since the Toilesters game. Their freethrows were considerably better, they hit 18 out of 33 for 54 percent. Personal fouls were not as prevalent, with only Owen Barnes fouling out.

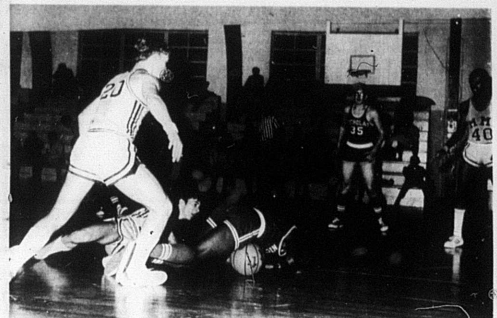
Nicholas led all the game except in the first few minutes of action when Bourbon County commanded a 6-2 lead. High scorers for the game were Smoot with 15 and Boyd with 12.

At MMI last Friday night, Doug Jones and Rex Boyd made exactly half of the Jackets' 50 points score; Jones had 13 and Boyd had 12.

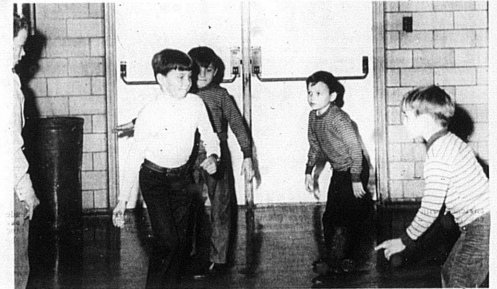

**IRON ENRICHED**  
Iron enriched foods are not new, but iron-protein powder from cottage cheese which is new—add may be a food additive to watch for if test results prove its value. Milk and other food products could be enriched with iron by using the new powder, which is obtained by combining iron with proteins in cottage cheese used, as reported by U.S. Department of Agriculture scientists.

So far, the taste panel tests have shown that the flavor of foods has not been affected by adding the iron-protein powder. No additional heat of pasteurization or other special treatment would be required to preserve or restore the natural taste of milk to which the powder has been added. Iron-protein powder has been used experimentally in baking bread which was acceptable in flavor, color, and loaf volume. The powder, a white, fluffy and mild-tasting substance, is a complex of protein and iron, and polyphosphate which was converted to a powder that contains about 12 percent iron.

If the Food and Drug Administration approves the new powder as a food additive it may become a preferred means of enriching some of our foods. . . . Candies and meringues made with honey may exceed excess moisture, making them soft and sticky. Freezing intensifies the honey flavor in baked products. If there is mold on your jelly or jam it is caused by an imperfect seal which allowed air to leak in. When using a double boiler, start with warm, not hot, water in the lower pan so the thawing food won't stick. Use small or end pieces of cheddar cheese to garnish or accent. If the pieces become hard and dry, grate them and refrigerate in a tightly closed container. Veal should be cooked well done to make it tender and pleasurable. It needs longer cooking because
