In Congress, last month, U.S. Rep. Sam Steiger of Arizona introduced a National Right to Work Law. Thus, for the first time, a serious drive is being mounted for a national right to work law.

For many weeks, the state of the economy has been the No. 1 domestic concern of the American people. The President and Congress have been grappling with the economy, trying to increase prosperity.

The national need—and the objective of the Steiger bill—is to make union membership entirely voluntary in all 50 states.

MRS. THEODORE H. OPPENHEIM, Mrs. Theodore H. Oppenheim (Anna Mathias) died suddenly Tuesday evening, Dec. 7, 1971, in Our Lady of Mercy Hospital, Coldwater, Ohio.

She was born in Carlisle on Sept. 2, 1891. Mrs. Oppenheim was educated in the Kentucky State Normal School at Richmond, in the University of Kentucky at Lexington, and at St. Mary's College, Notre Dame, Ind.

She began her teaching at Taylor Creek and at Pleasant Valley, Denver, Colo., her husband, Theodore Oppenheim, former superior in Kentucky, was in the military service during World War II.
