with Kentucky will be subject to federal meat inspection effective Jan. 1, 1972, under the new Meat and Marketing Service reports.

At least 10 of the 15 Department of Agriculture's meat inspection action will affect a total of 194 meat plants, including those which are exempt from full inspection, but will be subject to sanitation, quality and processing and labeling reviews.

Comments on Marketing Service officials said Kentucky meat plants who want to continue operation after Jan. 14 should immediately contact the CAMS regional office for information on federal inspection requirements. Inspectors should be in touch with Mrs. Harriet, Director, Mid-Atlantic Regional Meat and Poultry Inspection Program, Meat and Marketing Service, P.O. Box 2533, Raleigh, NC 27511.
