### Kentucky meat plants to have Federal inspection

Meat plants operating wholly within Kentucky will be subject to federal inspection effective Jan. 14, the U.S. Consumer and Marketing Service reports.

Officials of the U.S. Department of Agriculture agency said the action will affect a total of 194 plants, including those which are exempt from full-time inspection but will be subject to sampling and labeling reviews.

this? Not at all. With people earning more than before, they know that they can handle their obligations.

The Federal Meat Inspection Act requires that USDA inspect intrastate plants—upon 30 days notice to the governor—if the state is not effectively enforcing inspection requirements. This action brings to eight the number of states and territories subject to federal meat inspection.

Operators of intrastate meat plants who wish to continue operation after Jan. 14 should immediately contact the C&MS regional meat and poultry inspection office for information on federal inspection requirements.
