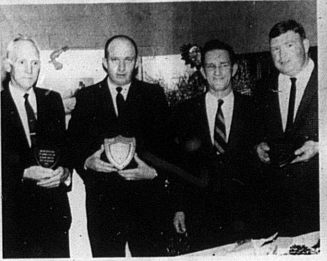


City Employees Recognized For Service At Christmas Dinner
