

CONGRESS VOTES

"Congress Votes" an important newsletter issued every week that Congress is in session. It will cover all votes on record and report the position taken on each such measure by the Congressional Representative.

For week ending Thursday, June 24, 1971.
 Whether to agree to H. Res. 433 which authorizes the committee on Education and Labor to conduct investigations abroad of matters within its jurisdiction. Year 183. Nays 119. Agreed to, June 18. Mr. Watts voted yea.

Whether to pass the Public Health Service Act (H.R. 7736) which extends for one year present programs of loans and grants to students in medicine, nursing, and allied fields. Year 299. Nays 0. Passed, June 15. Mr. Watts voted yea.

Whether to amend U. S. patent law with regard to the rights of applicants for inventor's certificates (H.R. 5237). Year 339. Nays 0. Passed, June 16. Mr. Watts voted yea.

Whether to amend the joint resolution establishing the American Revolution Bicentennial Commission. Year 1530. Nays 24. Passed, June 21. Mr. Watts voted yea.

Whether to authorize the secretary of Agriculture to reimburse states and local governments for the enforcement assistance within the law enforcement program. Year 360. Nays 2. Passed, June 21. Mr. Watts voted yea.

Social security amendments of H.R. 9270. To raise ceilings on contributions, extend health insurance protection, guarantee and disability, and (Title VII) blind and disabled children program, replacing it with the opportunities for families program and the family assistance plan.

Whether to order the previous question. (Vote on) H.R.S. 487 which makes it in order to consider H. L. A "Nay" vote would open H.R. 1 to amendments. Year 569. Nays 172. Present 2. Previous question ordered, June 21. Mr. Watts voted yea.

Whether to strike out Title I of H.R. 1, An "Aye" vote would retain the present AFDC program. Ayes 187. Nays 234. Motion rejected, June 23. Mr. Watts voted no.

Whether to pass H.R. 1. Year 288. Nays 132. Passed, June 22. Mr. Watts voted yea.

During debate on the Dept. of Agriculture and Environmental and Conservation Protection Appropriations Bill for 1972 (H.R. 9270), there were three recorded teller votes (after which H.R. 9270 was passed by a recorded vote).

Whether to amend H.R. 9270 to reduce maximum subsidy payments to a single farmer from \$55,000 to \$20,000 per acre. Ayes 208. Nays 198. Agreed to, June 23. Mr. Watts voted no.

Whether to amend H.R. 9270 to forbid stream channelization projects not already underway by July 1st. Ayes 278. Nays 278. Rejected, June 23. Mr. Watts voted no.

Whether to amend H.R. 9270 to forbid the distribution of food stamps to families with a member on strike. Ayes 172. Nays 225. Rejected, June 23. Mr. Watts voted no.

Depts. of State, Justice, and Commerce, and the Judiciary Appropriations bill for 1972 (H.R. 9272). There were two recorded teller votes during debate.

Whether to amend H.R. 9272 to add \$11.6 million for U.S. dues to the international labor organization. Ayes 147. Nays 225. Rejected, June 24. Mr. Watts did not vote.

Whether to amend H.R. 9272 vice from \$5.2 to \$1.0 million. Ayes 127. Nays 233. Rejected, June 24. Mr. Watts did not vote.

Whether to pass H.R. 9272. Year 337. Nays 0. Passed, June 24. Mr. Watts did not vote.

A procedural motion: from time to time the House resolves itself into the committee of the whole House in order to operate under the committee's more efficient Parliamentary rules. While in committee, members record support of a motion by voting "Aye", "Disapproval", "No".

Diabetic Camp To Be Held Aug. 8-21

limited number of "campers" are available. Further information and camper applications can be obtained from CAMP HENDON, 624 Fincastle Building, Louisville, KY 40202, Phone 302-383-4925.

This sixth annual camp for diabetics, sponsored by the Kentucky Diabetics Association will be at Camp Kyoco near General Butler State Park, two miles east of Carrollton. It will serve boys and girls eight through 15 years.

Most summer camps exclude diabetics children because of their disease. Camp Hendon offers them the opportunity to participate in the fun of a full camp program. At the same time it offers association with other diabetic boys and girls who share the same experiences and the same problems. There is also the chance to learn more about diabetes and the techniques of self care.

Facilities at the camp include a spacious lodge-dining hall, administration building, health center, two crafts buildings, a swimming pool and shower houses. There is a 20-acre lake with a boat dock and a fishing dock. The campers are housed in cabins grouped in villages of three cabins each.

Camping activities include swimming, basketball, row-boating, fishing, canoeing, camp-fire, night camping, archery, pony-riding, cook-out, nature hikes, dramatics, canoeing, camp-fires, hay rides, square dances and special events.

The staff is led by the special agent in charge of these children, Dr. James H. Berry, who has been trained, experienced counselors, many of whom are teachers or professional recreation personnel and a professional dietitian. Two doctors and two registered nurses reside at the camp during the season and provide the broad, constant and individualized medical supervision required.

The fee for the camp, as in previous years, is \$10.00. For those otherwise eligible children having financial difficulty, a
