

# Kay's Kitchen

First thing this week we will give those recipes requested, I assure you, green beans on the market are responsible for this one.

**APPLE CRUMB PIE**  
Enough raw apples sliced thin to fill a 9 inch pastry lined pie pan, 1/2 to 1 cup sugar, depending on the amount of apples, how ever remember there is more sugar to come in the topping, 1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Combine sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over apples to pastry shell.  
Combine 1/2 cup sugar with 3/4 cup flour and 1/2 cup margarine. Mix until crumbly. Sprinkle over apples. Bake in hot oven at 400 degrees about 40 minutes or until done. Serve with whipped topping.

**IMPOSSIBLE PIE**  
4 eggs well beaten  
1/2 stick butter, melted  
Mix together 1/3 cup sugar and 1/2 cup soft flaking flour. Add 2 cups milk, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 1/4 to 1/2 cup coconut. Combine all ingredients and pour into ungreased 9 inch pie plate and bake at 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes.

I ran this recipe for memory several weeks ago and seems I left out one ingredient and some proportions were wrong, so this is from the original. In spite of the errors one lady wrote kind enough to say it was good anyway on her original recipe. That is a pretty good recommendation, so don't give up, give it a try, it must be spelt many.

**CABBAGE CASSEROLE**  
Shred amount of cabbage needed and cook about 5 minutes in heavy covered pan with the least amount of water. Drain.  
Butter a casserole and put in a

layer of cabbage. Cover with a layer of cracker crumbs coarsely crumbled. Salt and pepper and dot with butter. Continue in this manner until all the cabbage is used, ending with the crumble and butter and salt and pepper. Cover all with milk and bake at 350 degrees until it bubbles and browns.

(This can be added, a few broken pecans in the layers—K.F.F.)

**"MAKE AHEAD" FRUIT SALAD**  
1/2 cup Kraft mayonnaise  
1/2 cup heavy cream, whipped  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
2 cups fruit, 1 lb. or, each drained peach slices  
1 cup Kraft miniature marshmallows

1/2 cup halved maraschino cherries  
1 banana, sliced  
1/4 cup chopped nuts  
Combine mayonnaise, whipped cream and lemon juice, mix until well blended. Fold in remaining ingredients; chill. Can be made hours ahead.

This will serve eight nicely. This recipe is also easily adaptable to other fruits. So you may substitute other fruits of your choice. I'm giving you this recipe simply because it is so delicious, the apples are in season and I think everyone should have the recipe.

**TRANSPARENT APPLE PIE**  
1 stick butter  
1/2 cups white sugar  
1 heaping tablespoon flour  
1 teaspoon nutmeg
