



Dr. Cochran MSU Commencement Speaker

A distinguished Morehead State University alumna will deliver the 44th summer commencement address, Thursday, Aug. 5.

Dr. Lewis W. Cochran, vice president for Academic Affairs at the University of Kentucky, will speak at 10 a.m. in Laughlin Fieldhouse, as 371 persons receive degrees.

MSU President Adron Doran will confer 242 bachelor's degrees and 124 master's degrees and five associate degrees.

Dr. Cochran, a 1936 graduate of Morehead State University, has been on the University of Kentucky faculty since 1946, serving in various capacities, before becoming vice president for Academic Affairs in July, 1970. Dr. Cochran was Dean of the Graduate School and vice president for research. A native Kentuckian, Dr. Cochran received his master's degree and Ph.D. degree from the University of Kentucky. He has also taught at Morehead State University and Cumberland University. He has conducted experimental research in physics and electronics. Dr. Cochran is married to the former Carolyn Wilson and they have two children.
