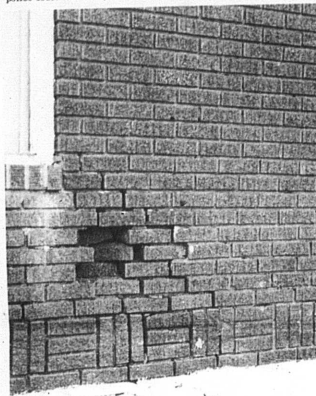

**Federal Intermediate Credit Bank
Tops \$700 Million in Loan Volume**

Joe Crouch, manager of the Carlisle office for the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Louisville (Production Credit Association), announced that the bank has topped the \$700 million figure for the first time.

The new high in loan volume represents an increase of nearly

\$117 million over a year ago in money outstanding to the 39 production credit association in Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, and Tennessee.

The increase is due to greater demand for short and intermediate term loans by farmers, some severe losses due to corn blight, and expansion of farm operations,

How is light bulb life determined?

The filament inside the bulb will last just so long, then it burns out. "Average laboratory life" as listed on the bulb sleeve means the number of hours of use you may expect to get from the bulb before it burns out. The figure will be an average, based on certain approved laboratory tests.

Some light bulbs are labeled "longer life." What does that mean?

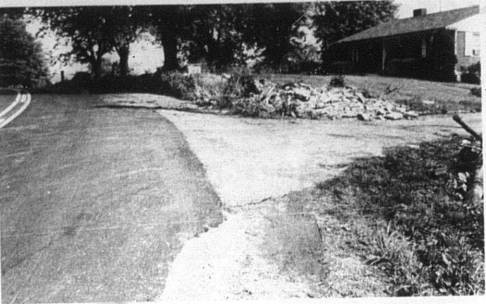
These bulbs are meant to last longer than "standard" bulbs. There's really no definition for the term "long life" but longer life means less light for bulbs with the same wattage. Here's why: A bulb has just so much light life in it and no more. That's because the filament eventually burns out after a certain amount of use. "Long life" filaments are heavier than those for standard bulbs so they last longer. But, by their nature, they won't give as much light.

Are any bulbs available that will give both brightness and long life?

If you want a "long life" bulb that will give you the brightness of a "normal" 75-watt bulb, try a "long life" bulb of the next highest wattage—in this example, a 100 watt bulb.
