Narcotics Orders Must Be Signed By Pharmacists

Kentucky's attorney general has ruled that it is illegal for pharmacists to type information in filling prescriptions for narcotic drugs.
The date the prescription is filled along with the pharmacist's signature should be written in ink to make it more difficult to erase, the opinion said.

The ruling was sought by a Louisville hospital pharmacy which said it is common practice to type the date of filling and the pharmacist's initials.
The opinion held the information must be handwritten on the face of the prescription to cancel it according to the law.
