Ford Wins Primary; Hart Takes 74th Dist. Representative Race

In Nicholas County as well as the state, Lt. Gov. Wendell H. Ford managed an upset victory in Tuesday's Democratic primary over former Gov. Bert T. Combs.

Combs conceded some three hours after the polls had closed. In Nicholas County, the former Governor polled 485 votes to the winner's 964 votes.

In the 74th District for State Representative made up of Nicholas, Bath and Montgomery Counties, Charles D. Hart, a Bath County native, received a 153 vote majority in Nicholas and won the district by 326 votes. Unofficially Hart polled 185 votes in Bath, 264 votes in Nicholas, and 553 votes in Montgomery, while his opponent Bruce L. Vice of Mt. Sterling received 359 votes in Bath, 411 in Nicholas, and 1903 in Montgomery.

The Grand Jury made the following report:
Inspected the public jail in the county and other public buildings. Failed to return an indictment in case of Community vs Timmy Sams because of insufficient votes.

Recommended that the Fiscal Court take immediate steps toward providing an entrance on the side of the jail.

Visited the Johnson-Mathers Nursing Home and Nicholas County High School, and after inspecting them made no recommendations.

The Grand Jury reported the front steps to the County Courthouse (from the sidewalk in front of Courthouse) to be in a hazardous condition and in need of immediate repair.

National Officer To Attend Kentucky State FFA Meeting

Hartinsburg, May 20--(Special)--George Allen, 20, North Atlantic Region vice president of the Future Farmers of America from Easton, New York, will be a featured speaker at the Kentucky State FFA Convention to be held June 2-4 at Louisville.

About 1000 Kentucky Future Farmers are expected to attend the convention. It was reported today by W. C. Montgomery, State Advisor. Two official delegates from each of the State's 157 local chapters will comprise the voting body to conduct the business of the convention.

State FFA officers who will preside over the convention are: Dale Smith, Meade County, president; Kenny King, Boyle County, vice president; Donnie Collier, Hiseville, secretary; Phillip Harris, Shepherdsville, treasurer; Robert S. Stuart, Daviess County, reporter; Charles T. Conser, Scott County, Purchase Federation vice president; Joe Moore, Sandy Hook,

Eastern Kentucky Federation vice president.

At the time of his election Allen was attending Cornell University majoring in Animal Science. He has taken a leave of absence for a year because of his heavy FFA travel schedule.

George lives on a 700 acre crop and dairy farm about 10 miles from Greenwich with his parents Mr. and Mrs. Norman W. Allen. Of the 700 acres, about 450 are tillable and the Allen's raise-corn, oats, wheat and alfalfa to feed the 200 head registered Holstein herd.

An active leader, Allen was class president in his sophomore, junior and senior years at Greenwich High School. In addition, he was a member of the National Honor Society and as a member of the track team he set a new league record for the half mile. Allen served as president of the Greenwich FFA Chapter for two terms. In 1968-69 he served as a vice president.
