sugar, salt and spices. Blend in milk, eggs and evaporated milk. Line tart pans with pastry. Fill with pumpkin mixture. Bake in hot oven at 450 degrees about 15 minutes; then reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake about 20 minutes longer. Cool and serve with whipped cream.

If you want a special taste treat, try 1 teaspoon of orange marmalade in the bottom of each tart for a change.
