State health meet Dec. 3-5
Speakers at the annual convention of the Kentucky Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation at Lexington Dec. 3-5 will include Dr. Lyman Givens, state superintendent-elect of public instruction; Dr. Samuel Proctor, Rutgers University, and Dr. R.F. Struck, Pikeville College.
The program of the convention was announced by Dr. Herman S. Duob, Chairman of the Department of Health and Public Health at Eastern Kentucky University and president of the Association.

Ky. owns 40 parks
If you wanted to refer to Kentucky's most popular attraction in a monosyllabic you could see the word "park." That would be cheating a little bit, of course, because Kentucky state parks include a multitude of pleasures and interests, plus such accommodations, wonderful accessibility and some of the most delightful scenery in the world.
There are 40 state owned parks and shrubberies in Kentucky. They range from a 1/2 acre historical site to a wilderness of more than 3,000 acres and they are strewn across the state from the eastern mountains to the great lakes of the west, from waterfalls. They were enjoyed by 23-3/4 million people in 1970.
Visitors from other states are often asked to find that Kentucky's state parks charge no admission. They are open free to everyone, every day of the year. Some of the facilities close hours of the parks during winter. But the parks stay open.
Fifty of the 40 parks are complete vacation resorts. This means that they offer excellent overnight lodging, top quality food in modern dining rooms and the complete range of recreational facilities. All but five of the 15 accommodations are in the state parks. Those five provide superlative scenery of a different type.
There are different reasons why all these millions of people view the Kentucky state parks, of course: Golf, fishing, picnicking, sightseeing, hiking, square dancing, etc. But there are two main reasons why more and more people are spending their vacations in and around the state parks. They are, again in a word, quality and quantity. The accommodations in the 15 resort lodges are superlative and so is the service.
Many people realize the magnitude of the Kentucky state park system or the astonishing variety of its amenities. To the visitor who stays open all year, has a total of 744 rooms.
There are 19 swimming pools and 18 sand beaches in the 40 parks. 14 conventional golf courses and eight miniature courses, 16 riding stables, two airports and five amphitheaters. Scattered through 14 of the parks are 302 efficiency or one-, two-, or three-bedroom cottages. For campers, there are over 1850 spaces in 22 parks. These are served by 30 modern central service buildings.
