With one again, off again, hot and cool weather, it is no wonder we find ourselves with jaded appetites. The recipes this week are made of fresh garden vegetables because canned and frozen ones are ahead of us during the long winter months.

Someone said to me the other day, "You have tried everything else, why don't you try fried cucumbers?" So now I have tried fried cucumbers and they are good.

1 used medium size cucumbers, peeled and sliced about 1/4 inch thick. I turned the slices in corn meal and sautéed the slices in hot butter and when lightly browned, turned the heat low and cooked until tender. Season with salt and pepper.

Just a reminder, eggplant is delicious cooked the same way. The only difference I usually use a mixture of half flour and half cornmeal and keep turning to serve crisp and brown.

Okra is also good cooked and sautéed in this manner, thus avoiding the slick consistency many find objectionable in this vegetable.

BAKED TOMATOES AND ZUCCHINI
2 or three medium size tomatoes
2 or three medium size zucchini
1 medium onion or several green onions
Salt
Pepper
Butter
1 cup crushed butter crackers
Peel and slice tomatoes, wash and slice zucchini, chop onion fine. Grease a baking dish with alternate layers of tomatoes, zucchini and onion season each layer and dot with butter. Top with crushed crackers. Pour 1/2 cup melted butter over crackers and bake at 350 degrees until vegetables are tender.
This recipe is easily decreased for two or may be increased for a larger number. As I have given it, four may be served.

1 small onion, minced
1 can tomato sauce
3 cups cooked cabbage (Cook only 40 minutes)
