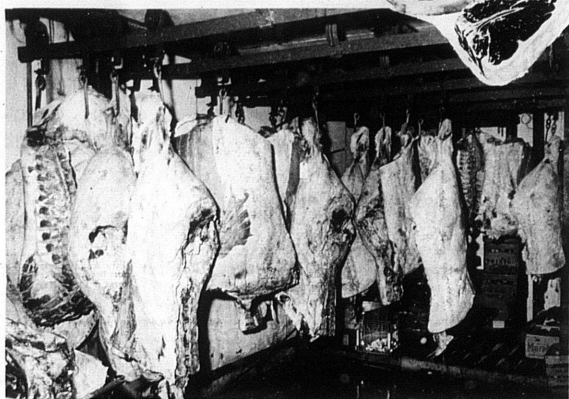

CONGRESS VOTES
Past week ending Thursday, Sept. 30, 1971.

The Economic Opportunity Act amendments of 1971 (H.R. 10351) authorize \$2.2 billion in fiscal 1972 and \$2.75 billion in fiscal 1973 for a variety of poverty programs. During debate in the committee of the whole, there were five record talks; three of which related to the Brademas Amendment. The latter establishes a Child Development Program operated by state or local sponsors.

The Perkins Amendment to the Brademas Measure allows towns with as few as 10,000 people the right to develop a program. Ayes 226, Noes 138. Perkins Amendment agreed to, Sept. 30.

The Erlernhorn Amendment to the Brademas Measure reduces the family income level for free child care from \$960 to \$430, based on a family of four persons. Ayes 187, Noes 189. Erlernhorn Amendment rejected, Sept. 30.

Whether to agree to the Brademas Amendment, as amended. Ayes 203, Noes 181. Agreed to, Sept. 30.

The Cordova Amendment changes the method of allotting funds to Puerto Rico and the Territories.

Ayes, 201, Noes, 162, Agreed to, Sept. 30.

The Devine Amendment deletes Title X of H.R. 10351. Title X establishes the National Legal Services Corp. to provide legal aid to the poor. Ayes 152, Noes 210. Devine Amendment rejected, Sept. 30.

After these votes, the House took the following actions:

On the Brademas Amendment: Year 186, Nays 183, Agreed to, Sept. 30.

Whether to recommit to the committee on Education and Labor the Brademas Amendment with instructions to report it back with the Erlernhorn Amendment. Year 191, Nays 180, Motion to recommit agreed to, Sept. 30.

Whether to pass H.R. 10351, as amended. Year 251, Nays 115. Passed, Sept. 30.

Week ending Thursday, Oct. 7, 1971.

Seat vacant, 6th Congressional District, Kentucky.

H. Res. 306 disapproves the President's Alternate Pay Plan for Federal Employees. The Alternate Plan delays until July 1 a pay raise scheduled for Jan. 1. During debate in the Committee of the Whole, there was one record in added funds for un-

teller vote.

Whether the Committee of the Whole should rise. (The motion would delay consideration of H. Res. 306.) Ayes 175, Noes 198. Rejected, Oct. 4.

Whether to adopt H. Res. 306. (A vote is a vote against the President's Alternate Pay Plan.) Ayes 174, Nays 207. Resolution rejected, Oct. 4.

Whether to suspend the rules and agree to H. Con. Res. 374 calling for humane treatment and release of American prisoners of war in Southeast Asia. Year 309, Nays 0. Agreed to, Oct. 4.

Whether to suspend the rules and pass H. R. 9901, a bill providing temporary insurance on member shares in certain Federal Credit Unions. (Under suspension procedure, an affirmative vote is required by two-thirds of those voting.) Year 197, Nays 122. Rejected, Oct. 4.

Whether to suspend the rules and pass H.R. 8083. The bill provides a new training and retirement program for Federal Air Traffic Controllers. Year 293, Nays 0. Passed, Oct. 4.

Whether to agree to the Conference Report on H. R. 8866, the Sugar Act Amendments of 1971. Year 194, Nays 91. Agreed to, Oct. 4.

Whether to appropriate \$270.5 million in added funds for un-

employment compensation in fiscal 1972. (H. J. Res. 913.) Year 303, Nays 0. Passed, Oct. 6.

Whether to extend until Nov. 15 the spending authority of agencies awaiting fiscal 1972 funds (H. J. Res. 916.) Year 387, Nays 12. Passed, Oct. 6.
