It is hoped that kindergarten will create an environment which will stimulate learning, permit social interaction, contribute to a feeling of security, self-confidence and

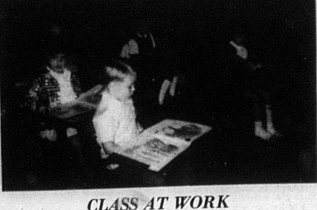

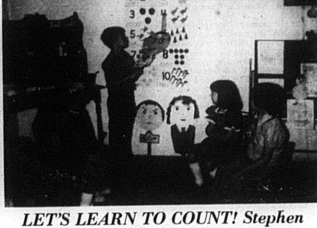
## WHAT'S THE WEATHER TODAY?
