

Kay's Kitchen

Fresh peaches are on the market now and as you know by now I usually push any good seasonal food. The list of delicious dishes made from peaches is long, so I'll give you just a few now and perhaps more later.

Maybe because it is so easy and simple.

PEACH CRISP

Peel and slice about 8 peaches and put them into a buttered baking dish. Sprinkle over them 1/4 cup

water and 2 teaspoons lemon juice. Combine 3/4 cup flour, 1/8 teaspoon salt, 1 cup sugar, 1/2 stick butter. Blend until like coarse cornmeal, add pea evenly over peaches. Bake in a 350 degree oven until fruit is tender and bubbling brown.

This is also a good way to fix quick-cooking apples. A good variation is to use brown sugar and add a bit of cinnamon.

ENGLISH PEACH SHORTCAKE

Use the English Shortbread recipe I have given you several times before and instead of using strawberries use fresh sliced peaches and thick cream.

PEACH SOUFFLE

Add 1 cup of fresh mashed peaches to 1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice (1/4 cup sugar) to taste) 4 beaten egg whites dash of salt

Fold in 4 stiffly beaten egg whites.

Bake in a 325 degree oven in small (about 7 inch) oven-proof baking dish, about 45 minutes. Serve hot with cream.

This is a good way to use over-ripe peaches or ones that have been bruised.

PEACH CREAM PIE

Place fresh peeled peach halves close together in unbaked pie shell with one side up. Combine 1 cup sugar and 2 tablespoons flour and spread over peaches.

Pour 1 cup whipping cream over all, bake at 400 degrees for 10 minutes, reduce heat to 325 degrees and bake an additional 15 to 25 minutes or until filling is cooked.

Cool before serving.

FRESH PEACH COBBLER

About 3 to 4 cups of sliced fresh peaches
3/4 to 1 cup sugar
1 stick of butter
Combine in 1/2 quart saucepan. Cook slowly, stirring often, until peaches are tender and syrup begins to thicken. Pour into 1/2 quart baking dish. Set aside and make your favorite rich pastry, roll thin and cut into strips 1 inch wide.

Cover peaches with some of the strips. Place in preheated 350 degree oven; bake until pastry is lightly browned. Gently punch browned pastry into peach mixture with a spoon. Add another layer of pastry strip on top and brown.

In this cobbler you have no fear of a white glazy mass of bottom crust. All pastry is brown and crisp.

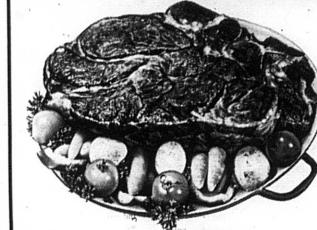

Outdoor Lore

When Salomon, reportedly the wisest man that ever lived, advised the sluggard to go to the ant, he was not talking about the ant as we know it, but he was talking about the ant as he is today. There is a lesson to be learned by observing these industrious, ubiquitous insects. As beautiful specimens trapped and preserved in the amber of the lower Oligocene period, which dates back to 20 million years B.C., attest, the ant was here on earth long before man and, because of its more powerful instinct of survival, will probably be here long after he has gone. Living as it does in highly organized colonies, it is a scrupulously clean creature and one of its chief cares is to keep itself and its home spotlessly clean. It spends much time polishing its wings and those of its fellows with an ant's tongue.

As it has a keenly sensitive nose, it is allowed to accumulate. Bodies of deceased ants are carried out immediately and interred in what some observers have termed "ant graveyards." Presumably the ant knows by instinct what humans have learned by experience: that unburied bacteria may grow in refuse and threaten both health and good supply.

Entomologists say there are about 5,000 species of ants in the world. Some are peacocks, but some wage war with great armies organized into efficiently carried out squad, companies, regiments, and battalions that carry out attacks in a definite and systematic manner. Some ants keep slaves which they secure by raiding nests of other tribes, capture eggs, larvae, and pupae which they care for until these have developed into adults. Then the raiders take their labor and force the slaves to do all the work.
