### FIRE INSURANCE on TOBACCO

2 cups all purpose flour  
2 tablespoons powdered sugar (sifted)  
1 tablespoon corn starch  
1 1/2 sticks of butter or margarine

Sift dry ingredients into bowl and work in the butter with your fingers until it is like coarse crumbs. Smooth out on a greased baking sheet until about 1/4 inch thick. Straighten edges by gently pressing with a spatula, smoothing top with open hand. Prick all over with fork. Bake at 250 degrees or 275 degrees about 30 minutes.

Cut into squares while still hot. Allow to cool before removing from baking sheet with spatula.

### BREAD & BUTTER PICKLES

This is a new one for me, given to me last week.

1 gallon thinly sliced green cucumbers  
1 pint thinly sliced onions  
1 quart vinegar  
4 cups sugar  
2 cups water  
1 tablespoon white mustard seed  
1 teaspoon sumac  
1 teaspoon celery seed  
Combine cucumbers and onions sprinkled with salt. Let stand 3 hours, weighted under brine.

Drain, toss lightly. Combine sugar, vinegar, water, and spices and onions, heat slowly, stirring occasionally, bring just to boil, seal in jars.

**Chili Sauce**

18 large tomatoes, chopped  
6 large onions, chopped  
4 red peppers, seeded and chopped  
2 green peppers, seeded and chopped

2/3 cup sugar  
3 tablespoons salt  
5 cups vinegar  
1 teaspoon ground cloves  
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
1 teaspoon ground allspice  
Combine ingredients and cook slowly until thick. Pour into clean, hot jars and seal at once.

**PICKLED PEACHES**

Remove skins from 1 quart peaches. Boil 1 cup vinegar, 2 1/4 cups sugar, 1 stick 12 inch cinnamon, and 1/2 teaspoon whole cloves for 10 minutes; drop in peaches, a few at a time, and cook until tender. Transfer peaches to clean, hot jars; fill with hot syrup and seal, lime, 1 quart jar.

**LIME PICKLES**

7 pounds cucumbers after peeling and slicing lengthwise in about quarters or slices. Cover with 2 cups lime and 2 gallons water. Let stand 24 hours.

Rinse several times with clean water. Cover with cold water; let stand 3 hours. Drain and cover with 2 quarts vinegar, 9 cups sugar, 1 tablespoon salt, 1 tablespoon pickling spice, 1 tablespoon whole cloves, 1 tablespoon celery seed. Leave overnight.

Boil 30 minutes and seal while hot. Use crock for soaking and granite for cooking.

### CONGRESS VOTES

For week ending Thursday, Sept. 23, 1971.

Whether to agree to the conference report on H.R. 10090, The bill appropriates \$4.7 billion for Public Works, including \$1.3 billion for the Atomic Energy Commission and \$1.3 billion for the Corps of Engineers. Yeas 377, Nays 9. Conference report agreed to, Sept. 22. Mr. Watts did not vote.

In a Nonrecrod Vote later, the House concurred in an amendment added in the Senate which provides that no funds shall be expended for the nuclear test area in Alaska Island, Alaska unless the President gives his direct approval for the test.

H.R. 9166 authorizes the appropriation of \$77,2 million for the Peace Corps in the current fiscal year. There was one nonrecrod teller vote.

In a Nonrecrod vote later, the House concurred in the conference report which reduces the authorized amount to \$50.2 million. Yeas 119, Nays 12. Amendment rejected, Sept. 23. Mr. Watts did not vote.

In a nonrecrod vote later, H.R. 9166 was passed.

A procedural note... from time to time the House resolves itself into the Committee of the Whole House in order to operate under the committee's more efficient parliamentary rules. While in committee, members record support of a motion by voting "Aye", "Disapprove", "No".

### USDA announces expansion of extended corn loan program

In view of the current supply and demand situation and anticipated production of 1971-crop corn, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced recently that loans on 1969 and 1970-crop corn extended (resale) loan, and 1971-crop corn put under farm-stored loan will be extended beyond their announced July 31, 1972 maturity date.

The extended loans on 1969 and 1970-crop corn stored on farms were to mature July 31, 1972. Farmers will be given the option to extend these loans until May 31, 1973. For the 1971 crop, the regular warehouse and farm-stored loan will also mature on July 31, 1972. However, producers will be given the option to extend their 1971-crop farm-stored loans until May 31, 1973.

The quantities of resale farm-stored loans outstanding for the 1969 crop is about 73 million bushels, and 123 million bushels for the 1970 crop. The USDA officials anticipate that about 300 to 400 million bushels from the 1971 crop will be put under farm-stored loan and extended until May 31, 1973.
