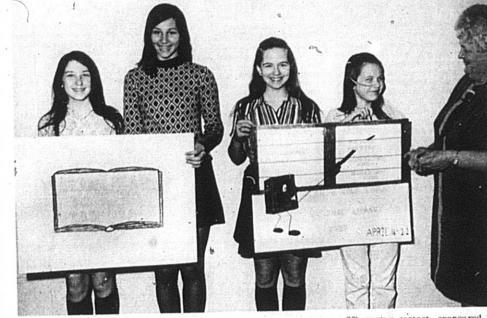


Burley price support given

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced the support price for the 1972 burley tobacco crop. The 1972 average support level has been set at 74.9 cents per pound. This represents an increase of about 4.8 percent over the 1971 level. The 1971 average support level was 71.5 cents per pound. This increase is required by law and reflects the

higher prices of goods and services which farmers bought during the past three calendar years (1969-71) compared with the 1959 average prices they paid for agricultural commodities.

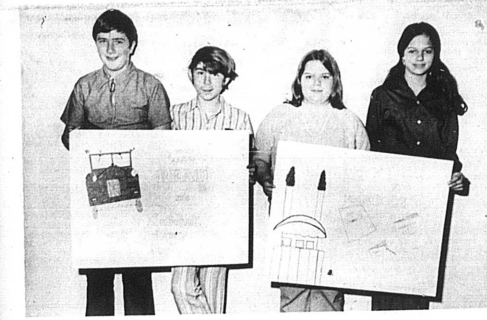
