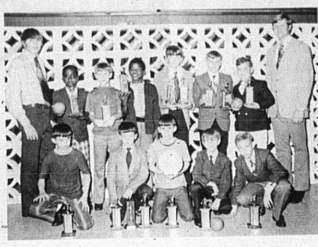

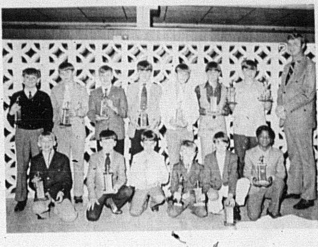

Livestock owners alerted to dead animal laws

State Agriculture Commissioner Wendell P. Butler is urging livestock owners to be alert to the law regarding the disposal of dead animals.

Commissioner Butler said the State Department of Agriculture recognizes that farmers often face problems in disposing of dead animals. State laws governing the disposal of dead animals is administered by the Department of Agriculture's Division of Livestock Sanitation.

Dr. L.G. Northington, State Veterinarian and Director of the Division of Livestock Sanitation, said it is important that owners be aware of just what the law requires. Basically, the law requires that all dead animals must be buried, burned or turned over to a rendering plant within 48 hours of death.

"We recognize the fact that many farmers may find it more difficult to comply with the law today than in years past," Dr. Northington said. He noted that in years past, farmers could call rendering plants which would come back and pick up the dead animals, without this pick-up and removal service.

Dr. Northington said that in many cases, rendering plants might not consider it feasible to come to a farm and pick up dead animals.

Kentucky Revised Statute 25.150 covers the disposition of carcasses, requires the following:

"(1) All carcasses of domestic animals which have died or which have been destroyed on account of any disease, except those destroyed on account of tuberculosis and slaughtered under the supervision of the State Veterinarian or other representative of the board, and except those ordered destroyed under KRS 257.060, unless otherwise ordered by the board, shall be disposed of by:

(a) Complete cremation of the entire carcass and all of its parts and products in water or heating it with steam at a temperature above boiling, continuously for two hours or more; or

(b) Burying the carcass and all of its parts and products in the earth at a point which is never less than 100 feet distant from any watercourse, well, spring, public highway, residence or stable. The carcass shall be placed in an opening in the earth at least four feet deep, the abdominal and thoracic cavities opened wide their entire length with a sharp instrument, and the entire carcass covered with two inches of quicklime and at least three feet of earth.

(2) The owner shall dispose of the carcass of a domestic animal, as provided in subsection (1), within 48 hours after the carcass is found."

Dr. Northington said some counties are making preparations to handle the disposal of dead animals at the county landfill. They have the necessary equipment to dispose of carcasses properly. However, it is the responsibility of the farmer to transport the animal carcasses to the landfill.

"Although farmers and livestock owners are faced with a problem when it comes to disposing of dead animals," Dr. Northington said, "they should be aware of what they must do to be in compliance with the law. If they are not able to get a rendering company to come to their farm and pick up the carcass, they must take steps to dispose of it by other means in accordance to the law."
