amounts paid them. All of them will benefit as a result of the new legislation. Retired workers who are unmarried will receive an average of \$1,932 a year instead of \$1,596. Retired couples will average \$3,240, as against \$2,676 at present. Their new maximum will be \$4,632, compared with \$3,888 now. The maximum for the single worker will rise to \$3,096 from the current \$2,592.

As of the beginning of last year, per capita payments in Nicholas county averaged \$479 per recipient per year. The Social Security Administration reports. Under the new setup, they will collect approximately \$1,055 a year, on average.

Gas firm relieves shortage

A spokesman for the Patrick Petroleum Corp., in Knox county, has informed the Public Service Commission his firm can relieve the gas shortage situation of Columbia Gas Co.

J. Hunt Perkins said the corporation could possibly supply two million cubic feet of gas from its wells in Knox County if a contract between Columbia Gas and Wiser Oil Co. were suspended.

The company also would explore the possibility of drilling additional wells if it had the assurance of continued gas demand.

The problem has caused Columbia Gas to seek gas services rejection for new residential customers. Columbia had requested to limit its sales to existing industrial customers, to refuse to accept new industrial patrons, and to refuse new residential customers after Sept. 1.

However, the firm amended its requests to allow more gas than it originally proposed to these industrial customers—two in Mt. Sterling and another in Carlisleburg.

Public Service Commission chairman William Loggert directed attorneys for both sides to file briefs within 15 days on whether the Federal Power Commission had sole jurisdiction over involved contracts.

Perkins' testimony was stricken from the record because it was speculative. Perkins will be allowed to cross-examine Perkins if the state has jurisdiction on the contracts.

Under the local area, based upon the number of people on the generation rolls at last count, they will amount to some \$1,085,000 during the next year, a considerable rise over the last reported total of \$888,000.
