Depot cancels 1972 deer hunt

Bow and gun hunters will not be permitted to hunt deer at the Lexington Blue Grass Army Depot during the 1972 hunting season. Reports from state biologists of the Kentucky Fish and Game Department and depot conservationists revealed a scarcity of deer for the second consecutive year at the 15,000-acre reservation which has been a haven for deer hunters since 1962.
"We felt a one-year rebuilding period would be sufficient to restore our herd, but this wasn't enough as the reports disclosed," stated James O. Sherrard, chairman of the depot conservation program. "An additional year is needed to insure expansion of the deer population."
Sherrard explained that depot conservationists and leaders of the Kentucky Fish and Game De-

partment feel hunters will be allowed to return to the field in 1973. "Next year will be a good productive year," he concluded.
During 1969 and 1970 bow and gun hunters bagged 1072 deer at the Blue Grass Activity located south of Richmond.
