

KU gets small increase

The Public Service Commission of Kentucky filed new electric rates for Kentucky Utilities Company designed to produce \$3,796,115 in additional electric revenue. The company had requested an increase of \$13,775,000.

Under the new rates, the average residential electric customer will pay about 75 cents a month plus tax and a fuel clause adjustment which amounts to 10 cents a month (plus tax) at the present time.

W. A. Duncan, president of KU, said the company plans to ask the commission to reconsider its opinion and, if necessary, thereafter, will seek court review. In addition to the revised rate schedule, the commission approved a fuel clause applicable to all classes of customers. The previous fuel clause applied to about half the kilowatt hours of electricity the company sold.

The commission order said the new rates were effective Aug. 2, and the order was issued. Mr. Duncan said, "the commission's

decision ignores the overwhelming evidence that the company has experienced a substantial increase in operating and construction costs which have not been matched by additional revenues. The limited relief authorized

falls far short of what the company must have if it is to continue providing quality service to its customers and attract the capital necessary for essential expansion to meet their growing demands."

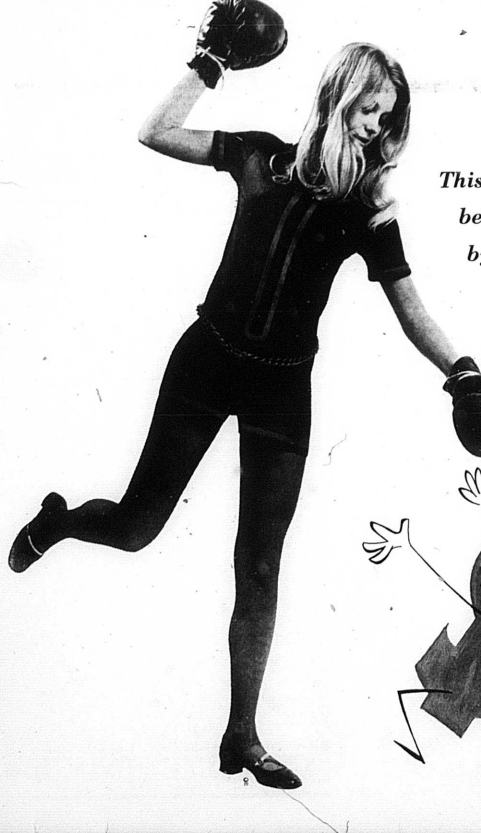

Outdoor Lore

Forestry division perfects tree seed

Frankfort—One of the Division of Forestry's greatest potential contributions to Kentucky's economy is its tree nursery program. To encourage Kentucky landowners in reforestation of safe and unproductive land, the division maintains three nurseries for the production of forest tree seedlings.
