

Kentucky and America prepare for birthdays

With the thought of moving fast toward the future to engulf the past, the newly appointed Executive Director of the Kentucky Historical Society, Charles Helmlann, said today that the state will be "geared up" and "staffed up" two years prior to the national celebration, and will be in an excellent position to swing from her own events into the national celebration completely prepared.

Helmlann emphasized the hand-in-hand cooperation between the state and the national bicentennial commissions and stated, "The regional directors of the Kentucky bicentennial while working on the state's celebration will also be working with the various regional and county representatives on the planning of the 1976 national bicentennial."

Kentucky is in an enviable position inasmuch as the state will be "geared up" and "staffed up" two years prior to the national celebration, and will be in an excellent position to swing from her own events into the national celebration completely prepared.

Helmlann says he expects to have his staff completed by Oct. 1. Plans call for four regional directors, one each from the following areas: Eastern, Central, Western, and the commonwealth's large Jefferson county and their surrounding areas. The regional directors will work with county and local bicentennial representatives across the state.

In addition, there will be state-wide advisory committees composed of historians, educators and representatives in the fields of religion, sports, and the cultural

Cooper expects agreement on Water Pollution soon

Senator Cooper, who is a member of the Senate Public Works Committee and the Subcommittee on Navigation and Solid Waste Pollution known as the Muskie Subcommittee - said today that the conference from the House and Senate had not yet reached agreement on the Water Pollution Control Act of 1972 but that he expected an agreement would be reached in September.

"The bill will provide control on industrial and other sources of water pollution and practical new age treatment plants with the purpose of improving the quality of water in two stages, the first through 1977 and the second through 1982."

Senator Cooper noted that two proposals he had offered during the conference had been approved. The first would authorize a basic Federal grant of 75 percent of the cost of municipal sewage treatment plants including improvements to bring the plants into compliance with law when the bill is enacted. The present law authorizes a Federal grant of 60 percent which can be increased to 85 percent when the States provide supplemental assistance.

"That far most Kentucky communities," Senator Cooper commented, "have received a basic Federal grant of 30 percent and 13 percent." Senator Cooper noted that the bill provided reimbursement to communities which have expended funds under the existing law up to 30 percent for those facilities constructed between 1956 and 1966 and up to 35 percent for those constructed between 1967 and 1971.

Earlier this year, Senator Cooper introduced in the Senate an Administration bill to establish an Environmental Financing Authority to assist communities unable to sell treatment plant construction bonds.
