Drug council to consider antibiotics

The Kentucky Drug Formulary Council decided during its Dec. 14 meeting to give first consideration to a group of drugs from the antibiotic class. Dr. Thomas D. Darby, chairman of the council and of the Department of Pharmacology, University of Louisville School of Medicine, explained that this group was selected because right now, it can provide the biggest savings to many consumers. Other drugs will be considered for inclusion on the formulary list as the council has an opportunity to give them proper consideration. The Drug Formulary Council was set up by the last General Assembly and is charged with the responsibility of creating a list of "therapeutically

equivalent" drug preparations by generic names and by their brand names. The council defines "therapeutically equivalent" to mean that two or more products are of the same dosage form, contain the same active drug or drugs from a chemical standpoint, are of the same dose and when the products are administered according to the directions of the manufacturer, a similar beneficial therapeutic response may be expected. The next meeting of the Drug Formulary Council will be at 9:30 a.m., EST, Thursday, Jan. 18, at the State Department of Health, 275 East Main Street, Frankfort, Ky. 40601.
