

# Agree Or Not

I Say What I Think

FRANKFORT, Gov. Wendell H. Ford has introduced what he calls a "budget" budget covering the next biennium that will raise \$1.5 billion in additional revenue to \$3.3 billion for the present.

Ford's budget is a little like Santa's pack. It has something for it for everybody and of the state.

Where does the additional money come from?

First, growth on the present base, after taking out for elimination of the five-cent sales tax on groceries, brings \$20 for the first year and \$40 for the second.

But when you add in the new tax package, there'll be \$173 million more in new money, minus some additional fees in a switch to some agencies, but these amount to \$4 million more for the biennium. Understand, this doesn't include the road fund budget.

The budget document is a little hard to understand, but Ford attempted to make it as simple as possible.

Gov. Ford has broadened his tax base by proposing a new income tax on coal, change tax on corporations and a two-cent tax on gasoline, and get more out of the automobile usage tax.

The effective dates of these taxes are important.

The severance tax and the change in the corporation tax become effective April 1 this year, which adds \$6.5 million between April 1 and June 30.

Elimination of the sales tax on groceries doesn't become effective until Oct. 1, 1973, thus giving Ford three extra months on the sales tax for the first year in the new biennium.

The one significant factor about the new corporation tax proposal is that it eliminates the federal income tax as a deduction when computing the state return. This is retroactive to Dec. 31, 1971.

Thus, when the corporate fiscal year falls within the first six months of this year, this portion of the tax is in effect a bonus for Ford for this biennium. The budget division estimates this at \$3.5 million.

The proposed two-cent increase per gallon on the gasoline tax is estimated to bring in \$33.7 million the first year and \$47.7 million plus another \$7.5 million because of a change in the reporting date from the last of the month to the 29th of the month.

The second year, 1973-74, is estimated to produce \$36.7 million.

And the change in the usage of motor vehicles is estimated to produce \$4.6 million the first year and \$4.7 million the second year of the budget. The usage tax is charged from 90 per cent of the "sticker price" on automobiles to 100 per cent. The change was made because the federal government repealed its 10 per cent excise tax on automobiles.

Without these changes and the additional income Ford could not have.

\$15.7 million in capital construction in the present biennium.

\$5.9 million for capital construction in 1972-73.

\$2.0 million for capital construction 1973-74.

Now what does this entail?

\$4.9 million for a 150-bed institution for the criminally in-

But look for this in the future—Public utilities will be asking the Public Service Commission for rate increases because of the price of coal. Money carriers will be asking the Department of Motor Transportation for freight rate increases because of the increased gasoline tax corporations must increase the price on goods and services.

The net effect—consumers are asked to pay for the tax increases. There's no other way.

—\$2 million for capital construction for the Old Capitol and the old Capitol Annex for the Kentucky Historical Society.

—\$2 million for road and river development.

—\$1.6 million for an addition to Fairgrounds stadium in Louisville.

The proposed coal extraction tax is five per cent of sales price at the production point, or 30 cents a ton, whichever is greater.

# Kay's Kitchen

**CHERRY PUDDING**  
Heat 1 can of red sour cherries with 2/3 cup sugar.  
Melt 1 stick of margarine or butter in 1/2 quart Pyrex dish. The 7 1/2 x 13 1/4 stick.  
Make a batter of 1 cup sugar, 1 cup flour, 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder, pinch of salt and 2/3 cup sweet milk. The milk more than makes a smooth batter but too thin.  
Pour the batter over the melted margarine, then the cherries and

juice on top of batter. Do "not" stir. Bake at 350 degrees until brown, about 30 to 45 minutes. Cut in squares. Serves 8 generally. This is good served warm with prepared whipped topping or a scoop of ice cream. If you have any left, it is good cold.

Should you want to dress this up a bit add a few drops of red food coloring and 3/4 cup chopped pecans to the cherries before pouring over batter.

With incomes such as they are locally, how much can the average Nicholas County family prudently afford to spend for a home?

How big a load may it take on the form of monthly carrying charges without getting overburdened?

The questions are pertinent at this time because many local families are in the market for new homes. They have been hunched over for a long time but have been unable to get what they wanted. The selection was small and the prices high. More recently, however, the situation has improved.

Some guidelines on home buying for families in various income brackets come from the Federal Housing Administration, the American Bankers Association and others.
