that with continued support the organization will play a leading role in achieving progress for farm families.

President Doyle said that in recent years Farm Bureau has led the fight for equitable and reasonable property taxes; has defended the state's rural road programs; has fought for sound tobacco programs and defended the livelihood of tobacco farmers; has developed livestock and grain marketing programs; and has carried forward other important programs, services and activities of the local Farm Bureau in the state, with a total membership of 119,205.

The Kentucky Division of Forestry reported that they have available tree seedlings for planting at this time. Some Nicholas County land owners did tree planting last fall. Most trees are planted in the spring of the year. The Kentucky Division of Forestry has the following tree species seedlings for sale: Loblolly Pine, Shortleaf Pine, White Pine, Virginia Pine, Black Locust, Yellow Poplar, White Ash, White Oak, Cherrybark Oak, Cottonwood, Sycamore, Scotch Pine, and Black Walnut.

Tree seedlings come in handles of 500. One thousand tree seedlings are needed per acre for timber production, erosion control or wildlife cover. The trees are usually planted six feet apart in rows of six feet wide.

The local Nicholas County ASCS Office is cost-sharing on tree planting this year. They will pay about 80 percent of the cost on tree planting. They also cost-share on other forestry practices.

If you are interested in planting trees or improving the ones you have, contact your local Soil Conservation Service office, Extension Service, ASCS, or Kentucky Division of Forestry.

**Cleveland firm purchases Cynthia plant**

The Acem Cleveland-Corporation, an international supplier of production tools and systems for industry, has purchased 130,000 square feet of general purpose manufacturing space in Cynthia, Ky.

The announcement was made through the office of Gov. Wendell H. Ford.

The building, formerly occupied by the Kawncor Company, stands on approximately 14 acres in Harrison County. Acem-Cleveland acquired the facility for expansion of manufacturing facilities for its various operations and for manufacture of contemplated new products.

A nationally-known football and basketball official and Lexington attorney has been named Chairman of the 1972 Eastern Seal Campaign in Kentucky. He is Thomas "Tom" Bell, who wears the familiar NFL No. 7 when serving as referee for the National Football League. His appointment was announced by Coleman L.
