

Medical scholarships offered

Applications are now being received by the Rural Kentucky Medical Scholarship Fund for medical students who will enter school this fall, according to G. L. Simpson, M. D., Chairman.

As the Rural Kentucky Medical Scholarship Fund enters its 26th year, it was planned out by the Chairman that the practice in 84 counties with 15 serving in "critical" counties, Doctor Simpson further noted that the Fund, in this period of time, has loaned over one million dollars.

In designing a program to assist medical students who need financial help, there have been three separate plans formulated:

1. A student may borrow up to \$2,500 per year, provided he will agree to practice in one of ten Kentucky counties most in need of a physician. For each year the recipient practices in one of these "critical" counties, one \$2,500 loan will be forgiven.
2. A student may borrow \$2,000 per year with the provision that one-half of the loan will be forgiven for each year of practice in a "semi-critical" county area designated by the board. The "semi-critical" county areas are selected on the basis of the ones with the greatest need.
3. A student may borrow \$2,000 per year who will agree to practice in rural areas other than the "critical" or "semi-critical" counties.

Local cost of raising children

How much does the average Nicholas County family spend in bringing up a child? Under present conditions, what does it cost to have and to rear a child? The answers are one thing, fancy to age 18?

Those questions come to the fore at this time because of a report, recently released by the Commission on Population and the American Future, showing what it averages on a national basis.

In the local area, as well as elsewhere, the cost is nearly greater today than it was when father and mother were children.

In those days, according to a study entitled "The Money Value of a Man," a typical family spent \$7,425 to raise a child to age 18. That covered the cost of child-birth, housing, food, clothing, transportation, education and medical expenses.

Nowadays, by way of comparison, that outlay would reach only about one-fourth of the way. The food bill alone, for an average youngster, runs to about \$8,500 in the 18 years, according to the Health Insurance Institute.

In Nicholas County, and everywhere else, the amount that a family spends in the process of bringing up its children is closely governed by its income. Those who have a lot spend a lot.

In general, it is found the outlay ranges from nearly 19 times a family's one year earnings, after taxes, to over 5.6 times earnings.

In the case of Nicholas County, with its average net income of \$6,000 per year, according to the W. II. and a member of the American Legion.

Q-Is it possible for a veteran to pay off his G.I. loan before the final payment is due?

the G.I. Bill, and plan to attend summer school. What should I do to have my VA education benefits continue through the summer?
A-After you enroll for the summer session, notify the school of your continued eligibility for VA education benefits. The school will certify your re-enrollment to VA, and you will receive your payments effective the date of re-enrollment.

Q-1 was honorably discharged from military service recently, and wonder if some type of insurance is available?
A-If you have a service-connected disability, you may qualify for Service Disabled Veterans Insurance. You must apply within one year of the date of VA notice that service connection is granted. However, you may apply before requesting or receiving a grant of service connection, and VA will determine whether you are eligible for this insurance. Also, a veteran may convert his Servicemen's Group Life Insurance to an individual, permanent policy within 120 days of separation from service.

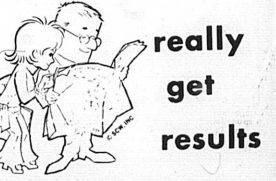
