S. Lee McGohan, 85, Fleming County native, and former publisher of the Ewing Register and the Rowan County News, died Jan. 1, 1972 at the Lake Park Nursing Center, Toledo, Ohio, after a short illness.

He was a son of the late Prof. James H. McGohan who taught at the Willow Dell Academy, Elizaville, and the late Ella Mae Hammesde McGohan, a teacher at the Fleming and Nicholas County schools.

former Margaret Tune McGohan, a native of Carlisle, two sons, Geraldine, Chicago, Ill., Robert Lee, Dayton, Ohio; two daughters, Mrs. Harry Hearn, Toledo, Ohio, and Helen, at home; six grandchildren and several great-grandchildren.

A printer by trade, the deceased served his apprenticeship in Millersburg and Carlisle, worked as foreman in the commercial department (at age 19) with the World-Advance Publishing Company, Advance, Wash.

He was manager of the Ewing Register, Kentucky Democratic representative, religious secretary of the YM.C.A., manager of the Rowan County News, a second lieutenant in the Kentucky National Guard, he was police judge of Morehead for four years, worked for the Portsmouth Times and was deputy clerk of Scott County for 10 years.

McGohan worked for the Toledo Blade for 15 years and was an elder and Bible School teacher at the Boulevard Church in Toledo, he belonged to the International Typographical Union, was a 32nd degree Mason, and was a member of the Independent Order of Odd-fellows.

Production Credit loans pass \$1 billion mark

The Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Louisville has reached a new peak in dollars loaned through the 59 Production Credit Associations in Indiana, Kentucky, Tennessee and Alabama, according to Brown, President of the Bank.
