"Uncle Pradell" Stevenson has returned from the hospital. John White is still there and Mable Darrell and Iva Gibon are coming from the hospital.

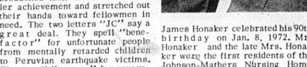

### Consumer fraud bill introduced

A consumer fraud bill that would outlaw misleading and deceptive practices was introduced in the Senate by Majority Leader Sen. Walter Dole (R-Ind.).

The bill is the first in a consumer-protection legislative package recommended by Gov. Wendell H. Ford.

"Empower the attorney general to seek court injunctions or prohibitory injunctions or both."
