Bradshaw who is busy with Revenue Commissioner John Ross and the budget maker in preparing the executive budget for Gov. Ford. Bradshaw said "money is short" but the six per cent increase will be included in the government which is expected to deliver to the Legislature late this month or early in February.

Melton said the salary increase will require an additional \$12,709,286 for fiscal year 1972-1973 and an additional \$26,520,677 for 1973-1974.

Older teachers have been asking if the Ford administration is going to fund the teacher retirement system bill passed in 1970 that allows a teacher with 30 years of experience to retire with full benefits.

Teachers now contribute 7.5 per cent of their salary to their retirement fund and it is matched by the state. Bradshaw said the budget department is exploring funding of this portion and the estimated cost of the year is \$6.5 million for the state.

Bradshaw also said explorations are being made toward the possibility of contributing to the private retirement plan. Prior years mean the state has budgeted \$14 when the retirement program went into effect. This has never been fully funded by any administration.

The last two administrations have contributed about \$400,000 each to the prior years plan. This year the state is contributing \$2.25 million into it during the year.

Ted L. Crosswhite, executive director of the private Retirement System, said the state has failed to fund the prior years plan for 24 of the last 27 years.

This still remains in doubt with the budgeters.

CONGRESS VOTES

Thursday, January 20, 1972
William P. Curtin, Jr., 6th Congressional District, Kentucky, Congress' Vote assumes publication with the opening of the 2nd session of the 92nd Congress.

The first record vote in the new session came on a bill providing for the creation of the Virgin Islands with the opportunity to elect NOTVOTING DELEGATES to the House of Representatives (H.R. 8787, Vote 252, Nays 104, Passed, Jan. 18, Mr. Curtin voted Nay).

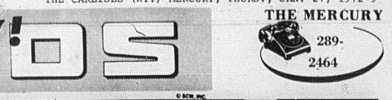
