## Comprehensive care center to be dedicated

On Sunday, July 16, at 3:00 p.m., the dedication of the new Comprehensive Care Center, Bluegrass West building, at 404 Ann Street in Frankfort, will take place.

The new building, covering two floors in a building previously occupied by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control, serves as the main facility for seven counties together, being responsible for mental health and mental retardation services and care in Anderson, Bourbon, Franklin, Harrison, Nicholas, Scott and Woodford counties and serving as a coordinating, funding and consulting agency to each county's individual programs.

The building will house most of the mental health and mental retardation services for the Frankfort area as well as functioning as a home base for the "area team" which includes psychiatrist, Dr. John Parks and various other staff who work out of the Frankfort Center and operate clinics throughout the seven county area.
