LEMON ICE BOX CAKE

This is a follow-up on the easy to serve meals during the summer months. Desserts, and they are an important part of the meal. Parfaits and ice box desserts.

1 can sweetened condensed milk
3 egg yolks
3 tablespoons of granulated lemon rind
Juice of three lemons
dash of salt
1/2 pint of whipping cream
vanilla wafers

Mix sweetened condensed milk, egg yolks and granulated lemon rind, and salt together. Add juice of three lemons and dash of salt. Pour this mixture into a 9x13 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes. Remove from oven and allow to cool. Whip cream and vanilla wafers together. Spread over top of cake. Sprinkle with more wafers. Chill in refrigerator for 2 hours before serving.

1/2 pint whipping cream
2 eggs
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup white sugar
1/2 cup cocoa powder
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup oil
1/2 cup vanilla extract

Mix all ingredients together. Pour into a 9x13 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Cool and serve.
