There is also the chance to learn more about diabetes and the techniques of self care.

Facilities at the camp include a spacious lodge-dining hall, administration buildings, health center, two crafts buildings, swimming pool, and shower houses. There is a 20 acre lake with a boat dock and a fishing dock. The campers are housed in cabins grouped in villages of three cabins each.

Camping activities include swimming, basketball, row-boating, fishing, arts and crafts, over-night camping, archery, potpourri, fishing, cook-out, nature hikes, dramatics, canoeing, camp fire, hay rides, social dances and special events.

The staff is ideal for the special needs of these children. They are trained, experienced counselors, many of whom are teachers of professional education personnel and a professional dietitian. Two doctors and two registered nurses reside at the camp during the season and provide the broad, constant and individualized medical supervision required.

For the fee for the camp, as in previous years, is \$10. For those otherwise able children having financial difficulty, a limited number of "camperships" are available. If insects bother you, don't walk through grass. Use bug repellent. Once bitten, you may need tea tree oil to soothe the irritation. A mild reaction to a physician's skin severe reactions.

Use gloves, particularly when pulling weeds. The resin found in the leaves of poisonous plants produces reactions. If the resin is not removed immediately, the reactions are worse. Wash your hands. Use suntan, clothes soaked in ice and application of calamine lotion help soothe itching.
