Democratic U.S. Senator Carlisle Huddleston spoke in R. Matthews, Friday, in a directors meeting of the Kentucky Farm Bureau and called for "a real reassessment of the entire agriculture industry."

"We need to see if our present programs are as large," stated Huddleston. "Do these programs filter through the administrative levels to reach the farmer?"

There are many practical common-sense precautions that farm people can take to prevent death and injuries and cut down the enormous annual loss caused by farm accidents.

A few things farm families may do to cut down on farm accidents are:

Check the electrical wiring on the farm; check for gas danger due to seepage that may cause fire or explosion; check chemicals and poisons used on the farm; check for fire hazards; farm ponds and creeks or streams used to swim in or skate on in the winter should be guarded with caution with children, always have an adult by life saving equipment, if needed. Farm animals can be dangerous. Farm tractors can be turned over by excessive rolling or on rough or steep land. Other farm machinery can be dangerous, can lose hand, foot, eye and get other injuries. A little time can save so much sorrow and pain.
