Wilderness Road Council to hold camp open houses

Friends of Girl Scouting in 57 counties including Nicholas will have an opportunity to view Girl Scouts in outdoor action.

The Wilderness Road Council has scheduled open house at Camp Judy Layne in Mendoc County on August 5 and 6, 1972. The camp is located in the heart of the Daniel Boone National Forest and is near Frankfort, and is made up of 210 acres. Camp Cardinal is in the hilly terrain of Carter County. Both this summer are offering formal camping programs for girls from the fourth grade school level through high school. Additionally, a Counselor-in-Training program is held at Camp Judy Layne to train girls 16 and 17 years old to become camp leaders.

For the second year, a horse-ownership program is offered at Camp Cardinal. Both camps have also a typical program of Girl Scout activities.
