## Kay's Kitchen

Since campers and trailers seem to have taken the country by storm, it has been suggested that I do a column on no longer camper cooking. From what I hear, camp cooking is no longer just using a can opener or dehydrated food but they are still important. If you are camping for a week or weekend and are willing to spend a little more time than just before opening the cans and eat your stomach. The trick for getting away from all the canned food meals is to use an insulator, so leave it in the bag. Put your frozen meats and vegetables in the bottom of the bag and the ice on top. Think it before opening the cans and open until you are sure of what you want. Remove meats first. If you are limited to a one-minute cooking time, use a meal with fruit or tomatoes, brought along in the can. Canned soups can be used as sauces for one dish meals or as soup with crackers for lunch. If you are a must in the camp food line. Remember your ice chest with dry ice does not take the place of your regular ice chest.
