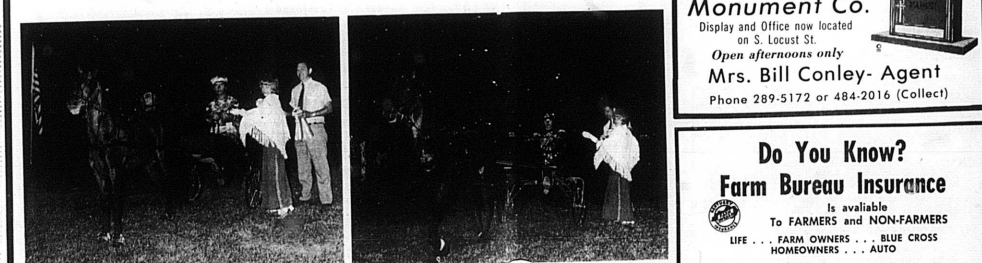
Judy White of Moorefield stands beside the pony which was given away at the Horse Show.
