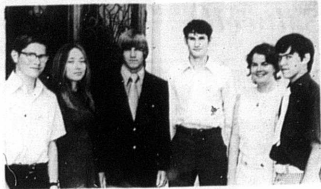

Frankfort, of increased electric rates, Kentucky Utilities Company said that the "economic facts of life" - higher financing, fuel, construction, and other costs - compel the company to seek the rate relief.

"Since 1958, the price of everything else in the country has risen, and electricity has been reduced. All that KU seeks... is approval to return to rate levels which will be still somewhat below those approved by the Commission in 1958."

"KU does not seek a greater increase than is essential to its sound condition, in order to remain sound financially, the company needs every bit of the increase it seeks."

A ruling by the PSC on the proposed \$115.8 million increase in rates which KU seeks will be made after proceedings which began with the filing of the company's application last Nov. 22 and ended with the filing of the last brief Thursday (June 22). Oral testimony concluded May 9.

The KU filing dealt at length with the argument of ASST. Atty. Gen. Laura Murrell, who opposed the increase, characterizing her

National Boy Scout tree farm day scheduled

The American Forest Institute in Washington, D.C. has announced that on Aug. 25, National Boy Scout Tree Farm Day, a number of Scout-owned properties across the nation will become dedicated to the permanent practice of good forestry.

Before that date, the Institute and the national headquarters of the Boy Scouts of America will be seeking to alert local Scout groups to the opportunity and benefits of having their wooded properties incorporated into the American Tree Farm System.

The American Tree Farm System, sponsored nationally by the Institute, promotes forestry practices on privately owned land which will provide for the growing and harvesting of repeated crops of trees, as well as recreation, watershed protection, hunting and fishing.

Since dedication of the first private property as a Tree Farm in 1941, the System has grown until today it includes 31,474 properties with a total of 74,309,767 acres.

Some lands owned by Scouting groups already are included in the System and are posted with the distinctive green and white Tree Farm sign, but estimates are that of the thousands of properties owned by Scouting groups throughout the United States, there are many acres that could meet Tree Farm standards with a minimum of work by Scouting groups. Such work would not only provide merit badge experience for individual Scouts, but also would further the aims of Scouting as a national project (SAR Give Our American Resources).

Gov. Ford claimed that the Senator from Maine is the "second choice" of most Democrats and therefore is entitled to the nomination. Meanwhile sophisticated columnist Roscoe Drummond wrote that the compilation of the popular vote before the New York primary showed Humphrey in the lead by popular vote with 4,030,358; McGovern second with 3,925,142 and George Wallace third with 3,602,868, and Muskie wasn't even mentioned since he had pulled out of the primaries early in the campaign.
