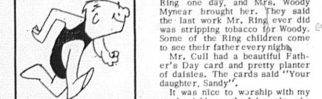
Mrs. Claudia Willis is sporting one of France's new permanent. It must have been a birthday present.

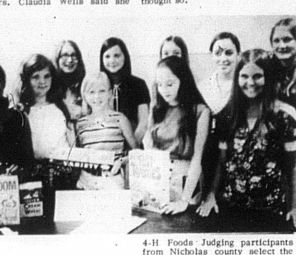
