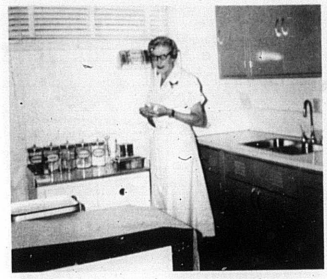

Catherine Christy Alexander, registered nurse, better known as "Katy", 43, of March 10, has worked as Public Health Nurse of Nicholas County for 25 years. She started this phase of her 40 years nursing career on March 10, 1947.

Mrs. Alexander is a native of Providence, R.I., and graduated from Rhode Island Hospital, in Providence, Sept. 19, 1931, in 1931-33 she did private duty in Providence and then in 1933-34 worked for the City of Warwick, R.I. as Public Health Nurse. In 1934-35 she worked in Providence Lying-In Hospital, O.B.S. On Aug. 1, 1935 she accepted a position at Veterans Administration Hospital in Chillicothe, Ohio, until 1946 when she came to Nicholas County. In 1946 she worked 10 months at Johnson Memorial Hospital in Nicholas County Public Health Nurse.

Also it was hard for her being a "Yankee" to find all the roads, creeks and hollows, when she had to make house calls. 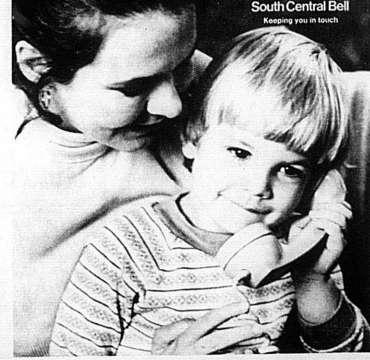
Mrs. Joseph H. Conley entertained with a dessert-bridge at her home on Thursday, March 2.
